IN THE MATTER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT ADDRESSING AREAS OF CONCERN WITH COUNTY GOVERNMENT OFFICES

In matters pertaining to the District Clerk's office, the Judge asked Bobby LaPrade for a clarification on his office policy of allowing children of employees to be in the office area during normal office hours. The Judge explained that he had been called concerning the caring of county employee's children in the office. He clarified that the Court could not make office policy decisions, but wanted to know about the Clerk's policy Bobby LaPrade stated that children would not be kept in the office. The Judge also requested an update on the trust fund issues addressed by the independent auditors in the most recent audit. Bobby LaPrade stated that they had been working on clearing up these funds and had already sent out some letters to dismiss cases in order to free some of the funds.

In matters pertaining to the Sheriff's office. Judge Flanagan asked what action had beep taken in response to the Jail Commission's letter to Titus County addressing jail overpopulation, the need for more staff, the transferring of inmates to less crowed facilities and the lack of services available to Titus County inmates. The Sheriff was asked to present the commissioners' court with some options/solutions to these problems. The Sheriff stated that to meet the requirements set forth in the Jail Commission's letter he would need more space to set up computers for GED lessons and would have to get the Outreach clinic to involved in setting up drug counseling programs. Commissioner Thomas Hockaday was interested in knowing why the Sheriff's Department no longer allowed an inmate work-release program. The Sheriff stated that inmates were bringing in "contraband", in spite of being stripped searched after working on the release program. A final concern was voiced by Judge Flanagan, which involved Titus County being delayed in getting prisoners to Texas Department of Corrections because of packages being lost. The Judge stated that he had been informed that the packages were being lost. The Sheriff stated that the delay was because visiting judges were slow in signing judgments, which is required before the Sheriff can proceed with the packages.
