# IN THE MATTER OF DISCUSS CLARIFICATION OF PLAT STANDARDS

Mr. Dan Hampton said, "The Plat Review Board was set up to reduce errors and to have a standard plat size. If a plat is to be filed in the Titus County Clerks Office it must be reviewed." Mr. Hampton stated, "Sherry's Office had been catching flak over the procedures for filing a plat. I feel this is unfair to her office and some clarifications were needed."

Representatives of the City, land developers and people from the audience discussed the matter. The following procedures were agreed by all.

- 1. The person submitting presents two plats on paper to the County Clerk.
- County Clerk calls Danny Welch for his review on the same day.
- County Clerk takes the plat to the Dan Hampton for him to take to the Review Board.
- 4. The Review Board sends to their reviewers for a period of no more than ten days.
- 5. If the Review Board does not approve, then it is returned to the person submitting for corrections. Plat is then returned to the Review Board for reviewers to check for a period of no more than 4 days.
- 6. Once the Review Board approves the County Clerk presents to Commissioners' Court for approval.
- 7. Once the Commissioners' Court has approved the person submitting then presents 1 mylar and 6 paper copies for filing with the County Clerk's Office.

SEE ATTACHMENT "A" for more details. No further action was taken by the Court.

# IN THE MATTER OF HEARING DICK McCARVER REGARDING REPLACEMENT OF PHONES FOR EXTENSION OFFICE

County Agent Dick McCarver explained the County Extension Office had to replace two telephones at extra costs. Mr. McCarver said, "Due to an electrical storms for the second time phones were having to be replaced. The

Southwestern Bell repairman advised us that the problem was in the connection to the County Barn phone lines. The first time we were under a maintenance contract. Our Office believed we were still under the maintenance contract when we ordered the new phones that cost \$588.88. We did not budget for new phones therefore we are requesting that this expense be taking out of building maintenance funds."

Commissioner Mike Price said, "I feel we need to check into seeing if we did have a maintenance contract. If not I believe we need to see about obtaining one. I feel we should hold off paying this until the purchasing agent can check into the matter for the Court."

Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday said, "I feel we should investigate into the cause of the phones being knocked out during electrical storms and try to solve the problem. If it takes putting the Extension Office on it's own line then we may have to do this."

No further action was taken in Court.

### IN THE MATTER OF SETTING 1997 SHERIFF AND CONSTABLE FEES

Ricky Poole, Chief Sheriff Deputy recommended to the Court that the fees stay the same except for thirty-one cents per mile after the first attempt of service. Deputy Poole said, "Most counties charge mileage after the first attempt of service. Many times the deputies and constables have to make several trips before service can be made. This could bring in more revenue for the County."

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Price to approve Sheriff and Constables Fees as they stand and to charge thirty-one cents per mile after the first attempt of service. Motion carried unanimous. SEE ATTACHMENT "B"

### IN THE MATTER OF CONSIDERING BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR CONSTABLE PRECINCT 1

Constable Chris Durant said, "My budget for 1996 is short due to the fact my phone bill is \$80.92. I do have some travel money left that I can line item transfer, however I will still come up short \$50.96."

Constable Thomas P. Gresham said, "I have money in my travel expense left that will more than cover Chris's shortage. I would like to offer the amount of his shortage to be transferred from my account. This will not cost the County anything and it will not take away from the new constables money for next year."

Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday asked, "Carl, can we do this?"

County Auditor Carl Johnson replied, "Yes, we can."

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Price to transfer from Constable Precinct 2 travel expense to cover the \$50.96 shortage of Constable Precinct 1 phone expense. Motion carried unanimously.

# IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Motion was made by Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Fields to approve budget amendments 121 to 135. Motion carried unanimously. These amendments can be seen in the County Auditors Office.

# IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING COUNTY OFFICIAL REPORTS

Motion was made by Commissioner Mike Price and seconded by Commissioner Mike Fields to approve reports from County Auditor, Commissioners Travel Expense and District Clerk. Motion carried unanimously.

# IN THE MATTER OF SIGNING PAY ORDERS AND PAYING BILLS

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Fields to sign pay orders and paying bills. Motion carried unanimously.

### IN THE MATTER OF CONSIDERING ACCEPTANCE OF WEST END OF SE-23 AS A COUNTY ROAD

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Price to accept the West End of SE-23 as a county road. Motion carried unanimously.

### IN THE MATTER OF CONSIDERING RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE PROPOSED SENATE BILL REGARDING THE TEXAS LOTTERY

Texas State Senator Tom Haywood will be proposing this senate bill to the 1997 Legislature requiring the Texas Lottery Commission return five cents of every lottery sale dollar to the city or in an unincorporated area, in the county in which the ticket was sold.

This bill supports local control of funds and has nothing whatsoever to do with our individual support or opposition for gaming activities such as the lottery. But it goes directly to whether we believe that our local taxpayers should have more control of their own funds. Titus County had a total of \$4,976,881 in lottery ticket sales in 1995. The proposed 5% would mean \$248,844 being returned to your local treasuries. The potential revenue of 5% is a substantial amount of income for our city and county for the future years.

Not included in the current form of the draft bill is a provision that Denton County would like added that would require a flat percentage of 1 cent being rebated to the county in which the ticket is sold whether in an unincorporated area or not.

Motion was made by Commissioner Mike Price and seconded by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday to approve a resolution for support of the Senate Bill of 5% refund from the Texas Lottery Commission to cities and to included a 1 cent per dollar refund to Counties. Motion carried unanimously. SEE ATTACHMENT "C"

# IN THE MATTER OF ADJOURNMENT

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas E. Hockaday and seconded by Commissioner Mike Price to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

### The Standard for Plats to be Accepted for Recording in the Plat Files of Titus County

#### **PURPOSE**

These standards have been prepared to aid in the orderly development of Titus County, Texas and to promote the general health, safety and welfare of the public. Using this standard will remind surveyors of important elements to be included in plats and will remind County Clerks or other Responsible County Officials of items which should be included before the plat is accepted for recording in the Public Record.

#### AUTHORITY

In all matters of interpretation and application of this Standard the final authority will be the Titus County Commissioner's Court. This standard may be modified, amended or voided by Commissioner's Court, at it's sole discretion, without notification or obligation to others.

#### DEFINITIONS

- A. SUBDIVISION: The division of any tract of land within this jurisdiction into multiple tracts, parcels, or lots (1) for development or for sale to the public, or (2) for the dedication and definition of streets, alleys, parks, or other portions intended for public use.
- B. PLAT: A map, drawing or chart on which a plan of subdivision is shown graphically.

#### PRELIMINARY SUBMITTAL

- 1) Preliminary submittal shall be made at least fifteen (15) days prior to a Commissioner's Court meeting. Two (2) identical paper copies of the plat shall be submitted for review to each of the following:
  - a) the Commissioner's Court
  - b) each other governmental agency having jurisdiction

The Preliminary submittal shall be accompanied by a remittance in the amount of  $\frac{S}{2}$  payable to Titus County as a nonrefundable submittal fee.

(2) One copy of the preliminary plat as approved, or marked to show the changes necessary for approval, will be returned to the subdivider or his designated representative.

- (3) Approval of the preliminary plat by the Commissioner's Court will indicate their approval of the rights-of-way of streets, alleys, parks and lots as shown in plan. Approval for recording may depend on acceptance of completed parks, streets, sanitary and water facilities.
- (4) Approved preliminary plats shall be noted in the minutes of the meeting at which approval was given.
- (5) Approval of the preliminary plat by the Commissioner's Court shall expire and become null and void twelve (12) months after the date of approval. Upon good cause shown, an extension of time may be requested; however, if the request is denied, then a new preliminary plat must be submitted for consideration and approval.

#### FINAL SUBMITTAL

- (1) One mylar copy of the Final Plat on proper sheet size and six paper copies shall be submitted to the Commissioner's Court at least fifteen (15) days prior to the regular scheduled Commissioner's Court meeting.
- (2) Commissioner's Court shall determine that the Final Plat conforms to conditions of the Preliminary Plat and that requirements of these Standards have been met. All required signatures (other than Commissioner's and/or County Judge) shall be in place when submitted to this Court.
- (3) Upon approval by Commissioner's Court, the plat shall be signed and delivered to the County Clerk. The following working day, the County Clerk shall notify the subdivider of the Court's action. Upon payment of the required filing fee, the County Clerk shall then cause the plat to be filed in the Plat Records of Titus County. As a courtesy, the County Clerk shall make paper copies available to the local County Tax Office, appraisal district, title companies and Registered Professional Land Surveyors.

#### STANDARDS

- (1) The plat and property description must bear the dated certification, seal and signature of a Registered Professional Land Surveyor reflecting the fact that the subdivision was surveyed on the ground by said surveyor and that all lot and block corners and other points shown on the plat were monumented with permanent stakes. Each monument shall be described in detail on the plat.
- (2) The Perimeter Boundary of the subdivision shall be shown with all bearings and distances needed for a mathematical check of closure. If the perimeter of this subdivision is not exactly as described by deed of the subdivider, then a metes and bounds description of the tract must be included on the plat. All

- documented permeability measurements taken at or in reasonable proximity to the drainfield locations.
- (D) At the discretion of the designated representative and in consideration of the size and density of the proposed subdivision and other conditions known to exist in the vicinity of the proposed subdivision, one or more geological cross-sections may be required from the applicant. These cross-sections shall illustrate the geologic formations that make up the subsurface below the subdivision down to the first aquifer that supplies, or may be used to supply, drinking water in the area. These cross-sections shall illustrate the primary dip and characteristics (permeable, impermeable, water bearing, etc.) of each formation and the elevation of any water table.
- (b) The required fee shall accompany the application.
- (c) Within forty-five (45) days after a proper and complete application has been made, the designated representative shall make a recommendation on the issuance of a Subdivision Construction Authorization, based upon the information contained in the completed application and any other information available to the designated representative. When made, said recommendation for approval, with appropriate restrictions, if any, or denial shall be submitted to the clerk of the Commissioners Court and mailed to the applicant within five (5) days.
- (d) When a recommendation is submitted, the clerk of the Commissioners Court shall notify the presiding official who shall place the matter on the Agenda of the Commissioners Court for review at its next meeting that is at least ten (10) days after the date of the submission of

the recommendation. The clerk shall notify the designated representative and the applicant that the matter is on the Agenda

- (1) Upon the approval of a Subdivision Construction Authorization by the Commissioners Court, the authorization shall be issued to the applicant. A Subdivision Construction Authorization does not constitute either a Permit to Construct or a License to Operate a specific on-site sewerage facility. An approved Subdivision Construction Authorization however, is a prerequisite for obtaining a permit or license for a specific on-site sewerage facility in a subdivision.
- (2) Upon the disapproval of a Subdivision Construction Authorization by the commissioners court, the designated representative shall so notify the applicant in writing within ten (10) days of the disapproval and shall include the reasons for denying the approval of the authorization.

(7.03. NOTICE.

- (a) Upon the approval of a Subdivision Construction Authorization, the authorization, the application therefor, and any other critical evaluation information shall be filed as a deed record for the subdivision lots.
- (b) Any person, or his agents and assignees, desiring to create a subdivision that will utilize on-site sewerage facilities, in whole or in part, and sell, lease, or rent the lots therein shall inform each prospective purchaser, lessee, or renter:
  - That the subdivision is subject to all of the terms and conditions of these Rules;

- (2) That a Permit to Construct shall be required before an on-site sewerage facility can be constructed in the subdivision,
- (3) That a License to Operate shall be required for the operation of such an on-site sewerage facility, and
- (4) That an application for a Subdivision Construction Authorization has been made and whether or not it has been approved, including any restrictions placed on any such approval.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, on September 23, 1996, the County Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas adopted an official Resolution approving the acceptance of the proposed senate bill by Senator Tom Haywood returning five cents from every dollar of the Texas state lottery ticket sales returned to the cities and counties.
