This refers to the realignment of voting precincts and the limited redistricting of county commissioner and justice of the peace precincts for Titus County, Texas, submitted to the Attorney General pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973c. We received your submission on January 16, 2001.

The Attorney General does not interpose any objection to the specified changes. However, we note that Section 5 expressly provides that the failure of the Attorney General to object does not bar subsequent litigation to enjoin the enforcement of the changes. In addition, as authorized by Section 5, we reserve the right to reexamine this submission if additional information that would otherwise require an objection comes to our attention during the remainder of the sixty-day review period. See the Procedures for the Administration of Section 5 (28 C.F.R. 51.41 and 51.43).

Please be advised that it is unnecessary to provide multiple copies of documents when making a Section 5 submission.

Please accept the enclosed information as a request for preclearance of a minor change to previously pre-cleared political boundaries. This change permits governmental offices to be included within a precinct, as required by Texas law, and affects no population change between existing precincts, nor does the change affect voting rights of any citizen.

Pursuant to the requirements of 28 C.R.R. Section 51.27, the following information is submitted:

(a), (b) & (c):

Tab 1: A copy of the Commissioners Court minutes and Order approving change of boundaries.

Tab 2: Texas Statutory provisions relative to change.

Tab 3: Affidavit of Commissioner Mike Fields regarding null effect upon minority voting rights or population demographics.

Tab 4: Map showing information regarding the location of existing political boundaries and the proposed change.

Tab 5: Evidence of Public Notice for Hearing on Change

(d): The effect of the submitted resolution and attachments will be, if approved, to shift the existing boundary approximately 97.5 feet south, and to include within the two affected precincts (1) and (2) a portion of a new governmental building. This shift permits the office of a Justice of the Peace to be physically located within

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the precinct, as required by Texas law. No voters inhabit the territory affected by the proposed change, and no voting rights will be affected by the change.

The submitting authority is the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the Hon. Danny P. Crooks, County Judge and Chief Executive Officer. The County Judge may be reached by mail at the Titus County Courthouse, Mount Pleasant, Texas 75455. Telephone is 903/577-6791.

- The Minute Order was adopted pursuant to the provisions of and in conformity with (h) Article V, §18 of the Texas Constitution, as well as Article 27.051 of the Texas Government Code, and Article(s) 292.001, 292.002 and 292.004 of the Texas Local Government Code.
- The Minute Order was passed by the County Commissioners Court on (i) August 28, 2000, as shown by the attached documents. The building in question will not be occupied until April 2001.
- The minute order takes effect immediately. **(j)**
- The provisions of the minute order will be effective, if approved, in April of (k) 2001, when the government offices will be occupied. The changes are perceived to be administrative and will not work as a deprivation of any voting interest by any individual in Titus County.
- These procedures will affect Titus County, Texas, only. (1)
- The reason for the changes provided in the Minute Order is to comply with (m) Texas law.

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- (n) The Minute Order does not affect the voting rights of racial or linguistic minority groups. The changes submitted do not affect voting rights, being administrative provisions only, applied to precleared election districts. The Minute Order does not have the intent, and will not have the effect of diluting the voting strength of any racial or linguistic minority.
- (o) There is no past or pending litigation concerning the subject matter of this submission.
- (p) The procedure utilized in the adoption of the Minute Order is not subject to preclearance.
