
BOB FITCH, COMMISSIONER PRECINCT #1

County floodplain maps to be updated

Titus County commissioners will work with Federal Emergency Management Agency representatives in coming weeks to determine the county's new floodplain boundaries.

It's been roughly 30 years since the county's floodplains map - which includes White Oak, Sulphur River and Ripley rivers - were updated.

On Monday, commissioners approved an agreement with FEMA to help make any modifications to its national floodplain map.

Precinct 2 Commissioner Mike Fields said he doesn't anticipate any major changes to the maps when a representative visits next week.

"There may be some changes, but overall, the floodplain areas haven't changed in all these years," said Fields, whose precinct includes the

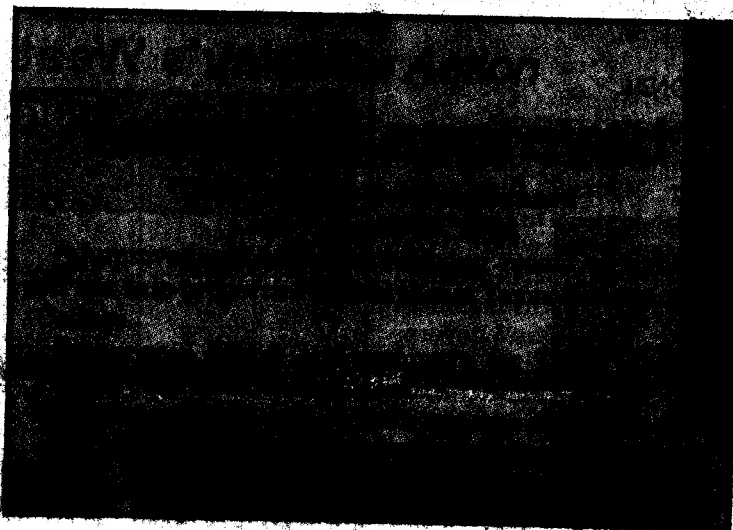
Ripley River.

"Precincts 1 and 2 probably have the largest floodplain area," Fields said. The Sulphur River makes its home in Precinct 3 while White Oak River is located in Precinct 1.

Several years of drought-like conditions have kept many county areas from flooding, Fields and Precinct

3 Commissioner Phillip Hinton agreed. With recent rain, Hinton said areas near the Sulphur River at northern Titus County have flooded.

Fields said it can be hard for homeowners who live in floodplains to obtain home insurance. Homeowners sometimes have to turn to the federal government for assistance.


Our firm represents Northeast Texas Community College in the collection of their delinquent property taxes. The College holds partial title to numerous properties located within Camp, Titus and Morris Counties due to these properties being "struck-off" at delinquent tax sales. Your governmental entity holds title with Northeast Texas Community College to those properties that were struck-off within the area where your entities boundaries overlap with the College's.

Since these properties are owned by the local tax entities, they produce no tax revenue and may pose an actual burden to the entities. Therefore, Northeast Texas Community College would like to dispose of these properties by selling them to private parties as efficiently, equitably and quickly as possible. To accomplish this, Northeast Texas Community College proposes the use of public auctions run by a private auctioneer; however, it is essential that most, if not all, of the entities agree to this method before proceeding.

Therefore, Northeast Texas Community College would appreciate the governing body of your entity passing a resolution in support of the public auction/private auctioneer method of reselling struck-off tax sale property. If most of the entities agree to this method, Northeast Texas Community College will issue a request for qualification so that interested auctioneers can be evaluated and the most appropriate one selected.

On behalf of NETCC, our firm is asking that you please place the consideration of the resale of this "struck-off" property on your governing body's next agenda. For your convenience, I have drafted a resolution that can be used in this regard.

Community Partner Memorandum of Agreement

AGREEMENT is made on May 20, 2008, by these parties: Titus County, Texas and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

BECAUSE, the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), established by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, has several purposes, the most significant being:

- To better indemnify individuals from losses through the availability of flood insurance;
- To reduce future flood damages through community floodplain management regulations; and
- To reduce costs for disaster assistance and flood control.

BECAUSE, a critical component of this program is the identification and mapping of the nation's floodplains to create a broad-based awareness of the flood hazard and to provide the data necessary for community floodplain management programs and to actuarially rate flood insurance;

BECAUSE, FEMA administers the NFIP and is authorized by §1360 of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended (42 U.S.C. 4101), to establish and update flood-risk zone data in floodplain areas.

BECAUSE, in the identification of flood-prone areas, FEMA is authorized to consult with, receive information from, and enter into agreements or other arrangements with the head of any State, regional, or local agency in order to identify these flood-prone areas;

BECAUSE, FEMA encourages strong Federal, State, regional, and local partnerships for the purposes of reducing flood losses and disaster assistance; and FEMA and its State, regional, and local partners have determined that it is advantageous to encourage and formalize greater cooperation in the flood hazard identification and mapping processes;

BECAUSE, Titus County, Texas participates in the NFIP, and Sam W. Russell, Titus County Judge, has been deemed by FEMA to be in good standing in the NFIP; and

BECAUSE, Titus County, Texas has expressed a desire to cooperate with FEMA in the flood hazard identification process and has worked with FEMA to identify and prioritize Titus County, Texas's flood mapping needs and develop a scope of study to produce an updated digital flood map.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed that the parties enter into this agreement to work together to produce an updated, digital flood map for Titus County, Texas.
