RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COUNTY GRANT

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF TITUS COUNTY TEXAS (County)
CERTIFYING THAT THE COUNTY HAS MADE A GRANT TO
N.E.T. Opportunities, Inc.
(Organization) AN ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES HOME-DELIVERED MEALS TO HOMEBOUND PERSONS IN THE COUNTY WHO ARE ELDERLY AND/OR HAVE A DISABILITY AND CERTIFYING THAT THE COUNTY HAS APPROVED THE ORGANIZATION'S ACCOUNTING SYSTEM OR FISCAL AGENT.
WHEREAS, the Organization desires to apply for grant funds from the Texas Department of Agriculture to supplement and extend existing services homebound persons in the County who are elderly and/or have a disability, pursuant to the Home-Delivered Meal Grant Program (Program); and
WHEREAS, the Program rules require the County in which an Organization is providing home- delivered meal services to make a grant to the Organization, in order for the Organization to be eligible to receive Program grant funds; and
WHEREAS, the Program rules require the County to approve the Organization's accounting system or fiscal agent, in order for the Organization to be eligible to receive Program grant funds.
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY: SECTION 1: The County hereby certifies that it has made a grant to the Organization in the amount of \$1,372.75 to be used between the:
1 of February, 2015 and the 31 of January, 2016.
SECTION 2: The County hereby certifies that the Organization provides home-delivered meals to homebound persons in the County who are elderly and/or have a disability.
SECTION 3: The County hereby certifies that it has approved the Organization's accounting system or fiscal agent.

- In 2007, the Texas Department of Agriculture began administering the \$20 million Texans Feeding Texans: Home-Delivered Meal Grant Program
- An estimated 450 meal providers will be eligible to receive funding through this program
- Qualified meal providers are eligible to receive funds to supplement and expand home-delivered meal service
- Funds will be distributed among all qualified meal providers
- Recipients are using grant funds to add weekend meals and breakfasts, shorten waiting lists, and meet rising fuel costs

The Role of the Counties

Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) funds are available to all counties that have home-delivered meal providers.

Counties can bring TDA dollars to their communities by making grants to qualified nonprofit meal providers.

If the county makes grants to providers totaling \$0.25 or more per county senior as reported in the most recent decennial census, those providers will be eligible for maximum TDA dollars. Lesser county grants qualify providers for pro-rated TDA grants.

If a county makes grants to multiple meal providers, the amount of those grants will be totaled to determine the county's overall participation level.

Counties that provide homebound mealdelivery services may apply directly to TDA as providers.

The Role of the Meal Providers

A nonprofit organization or governmental agency that delivers meals to homebound elderly or disabled individuals is eligible to apply for a grant through the Home-Delivered Meal Grant Program.

In order for providers to qualify for funds, they must first obtain a grant from the county(ies) in which they serve meals.



A complete application includes:

- 1. TDA application form
- 2. Recent audit or financial statements
- 3. Completed county resolution form stating the county grant amount

If applicant is a nonprofit, also include:

- 4. 501(c)(3) IRS determination letter
- 5. List of organization's board members and officers

The Role of the Texas Department of Agriculture

It is TDA's intent to develop and administer a simple and effective grant program.

TDA staff will work with meal providers and their counties to ensure all qualified providers receive funding through this program.

Applications must be postmarked by November 1 each year.

Counties can bring TDA dollars to their communities by making qualifying grants to meal providers. County grants should be based on the county seniors as reported by the census: 2010 Census Numbers per County.

A grant equivalent to \$0.25 per county senior as reported in the 2010 census qualifies meal providers for funds under the Program.

County grants at rates less than \$0.25 per county senior will qualify providers for correspondingly smaller TDA grants.

If a county has multiple meal providers, the individual county qualifying grants will be totaled to determine the County's overall participation level.


