CHAPTER 27 VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this procedure is to establish training requirements for volunteer firefighters in the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department. Training requirements are based on what job(s) the person wants to perform.

SCOPE:

This procedure applies to all volunteer firefighters in the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department as well as any other volunteer firefighters operating on an incident where the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department is responsible for Incident Command. **EXCEPTION:** Driver/Operator training for volunteer firefighters outside MPFD will be determined by the department sending the personnel/apparatus.

POLICY/INTRODUCTION:

There are many jobs to be performed at the scene of an emergency. The Mt. Pleasant Fire Department recognizes that there are people who are willing to fulfill the role of a member who wants to be trained to do all the job functions at the scene of any emergency. We also recognize that there are people who are willing to be trained to do limited firefighting, such as grass fires, and/or do the peripheral and support functions at the scene of an emergency. Each job function is important to the successful outcome of the emergency and with that objective in mind this procedure outlines the *minimum* requirements for the different jobs to be performed and criteria for each. Persons wanting to be volunteer firefighters in the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department may choose to become trained in all aspects of the fire and rescue service or they may choose to be trained in only certain areas. We will work with individuals to try and meet their needs as well as the needs of the Department. The Department does not require a minimum number of hours in a subject to become trained in that particular subject. The only requirement is that individuals demonstrate their proficiency in the particular subject/subjects chosen by the individual which may require a written and/or practical skills test.

There is no substitute for "common sense" and no manual can cover all the situations that may be encountered. However, these operational procedures are designed to provide a basis for operations and information to be used to make decisions when unusual or out of the ordinary situations are encountered. Any item in the SOP that states "**SHALL**", SHALL not be deviated from in its performance by personnel.

SECTION I. TRAINING

STRUCTURAL FIREFIGHTER (Firefighter I-152 hrs. Firefighter II-49 hrs)

To be qualified to participate in live fire training inside a structure, personnel shall successfully complete the State Firemans and Fire Marshalls Association (SFFMA) Introductory Level or equivalent.

To be qualified to participate in on scene interior structural firefighting, personnel shall successfully complete NFPA 1001 Firefighter I.

Personnel are encouraged to pursue completion of NFPA 1001 Firefighter II.

WILDLAND FIREFIGHTER (SFFMA Wildland Firefighter-12 hrs, Engine Module-8 hrs.)

To be qualified for Wildland firefighting, personnel must successfully complete the SFFMA Wildland Class, or equivalent, and the Engine Operations for Wildland Fire Suppression and Structure Protection class (TIFMAS Engine Module).

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONDER (4hrs.)

To be qualified to respond to a HAZ-MAT incident personnel must successfully complete a HAZ-MAT Awareness Level class meeting the NFPA 472 standard, as a minimum.

Personnel are encouraged to pursue completion of the a HAZ-MAT Operations Level class.

Diver

PADI , NAUI or other national diver certification is required in order to be qualified as a diver.

Driver Operator (16 hrs.)

Volunteer Firefighters prior to operating fire apparatus and/or personal vehicles as emergency vehicles in accordance with the Texas Transportation Code shall meet the following:

- Obtain and keep current a Class "B" non CDL Texas drivers license. (applies only for volunteer firefighters approved to drive department apparatus.)
- Successful completion of VFIS Emergency Vehicle Driver Training Program (MPFD Drive6) (applies only for volunteer firefighters approved to drive department apparatus.)
- Viewing of VFIS Emergency Vehicle Rollover Prevention DVD (MPFD Drive4) (applies only for volunteer firefighters approved to drive department apparatus.)
- Viewing of VFIS Intersections-Operation Safe Arrival DVD (MPFD Drive3) (applies only to volunteer firefighters who operate their vehicles as emergency vehicles and/or drive department apparatus.)

- Viewing of Privately-Owned Vehicle (POV) Operations-Answering the Call Safely (MPFD Drive2) (applies only to volunteer firefighters who operate their personal vehicles as an emergency vehicle according to the Texas Transportation Code).
- Comply with the City of Mt. Pleasant's Personnel and Safety Policies Handbook requirements for driving records.

SUPPORT PERSONNEL (12hrs.)

To be qualified to perform fireground support functions, personnel shall successfully complete the Mt. Pleasant Fire Department Fireground Support Class or equivalent. (All volunteer firefighters are required to have this training)

COURAGE TO BE SAFE PROGRAM (4hrs.)

This class is designed to change the culture of accepting the loss of firefighters as a normal occurrence. Building on the untold story of LODD survivors, it reveals how family members must live with the consequences of a firefighter death and provides a focus on the need for firefighters and officers to change fundamental attitudes and behaviors in order to prevent line of duty deaths. The central theme promotes the courage to do the right thing in order to protect yourself and other firefighters and ensure that "Everyone Goes Home" at the end of a tour of duty and/or response to an incident. (All volunteer firefighters are required to have this class)

INFECTIOUS DISEASES (1hr.)

All personnel shall be provided initial training on infectious diseases, including Hep "B", in order for them to make an informed decision on whether or not to get vaccinated for Hep "B".

NIMS ICS 100 (2hrs.)

This course is an introduction to the Incident Command System and provides the foundation for higher level ICS training. This course describes the history, features and principles, and organizational structure of the Incident Command System. It also explains the relationship between ICS and the National Incident Management System (NIMS). (All volunteer firefighters are required to have this class). This is to be completed within 60 days of joining the department.

NIMS ICS 700 (2hrs.)

This course introduces and overviews the National Incident Management System (NIMS). NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template to enable all government, private-sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work together during domestic incidents. (All volunteer firefighters are required to have the class). This is to be completed within 60 days of joining the department.

As new people join the fire department they will be classified as a Trainee until such time as they are trained for the position(s) that they want to serve in on the department. As a Trainee, the person will be closely supervised by an experienced Officer or firefighter while operating at an incident. Trainees will not be allowed to conduct firefighting operations in Hot Zones of incidents considered to be extremely hazardous or where there is extreme fire behavior until such time they have received the proper training and demonstrated their proficiency.

The Trainee is expected to obtain training in the position(s) they want to serve in as soon as classes are available.

NOTE: Hours for the classes are approximate. The classes may be longer or shorter depending on size and aptitude of class.
