# 6. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE A 40 MPH SPEED LIMIT ON CR 1240 FROM CR 1220</u> <u>TO CR 1140 (ROGER LEDBETTER)</u>

# 21. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE A PROPOSED MODIFICATION TO TAX ABATEMENT</u> <u>APPROVED ON OCTOBER 6, 2015 AND AMENDED ON MARCH 14, 2016 FOR PRIEFERT</u> <u>MANUFACTURING/PMCI PROPERTIES II</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a proposed Modification to Tax Abatement approved on October 6, 2015 and amended on March 14, 2016 for Priefert Manufacturing/PMCI Properties II due to negotiation period required between the Company and the Union Pacific RR going beyond the anticipated timeframe and delaying construction. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 14)

# 22. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE A PROPOSED MODIFICATION TO TAX ABATEMENT</u> <u>APPROVED ON NOVEMBER 17, 2015 FOR PRIEFERT MANUFACTURING/PMCI</u> <u>PROPERTIES II</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a Proposed Modification to Tax Abatement approved on November 17, 2015 for Priefert Manufacturing/PMCI Properties II due to the Company experiencing difficulty in bringing the Tube Mill from Mexico. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 15)

# 23. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE CONTRACTING WITH SUDDENLINK TO PROVIDE</u> <u>TELEPHONE, LONG DISTANCE AND INTERNET SERVICES</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Applewhite and seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve contracting with Suddenlink to provide telephone, long distance and internet services for the Sheriff's office. Motion passed unanimously. <u>(SEE ATTACHMENT 16)</u>

# 24. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE A BOND FOR WOODY HUGHES, RESERVE DEPUTY</u> <u>CONSTABLE, PCT. 1</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Fields to approve a bond for Woody Hughes, Reserve Deputy Constable, Precinct 1. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 17)

# 25. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE PLACEMENT OF MARKER FOR K9 OFFICER NITRO</u> <u>NEXT TO FIRST RESPONDERS' MEMORIAL</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve placement of marker for K9 Officer Nitro next to First Responders' Memorial. Motion passed four to one with Commissioner Riddle voting nay. (SEE ATTACHMENT 18)

Steve Austin, Veterans' Service Officer, invited the Court to attend a Flag Retirement Ceremony at the southwest corner of the Courthouse at noon on Wednesday, 6/14/2017.

# 26. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE USE OF SHERIFF'S VEHICLE FOR TEMPORARY</u> <u>TRAFFIC CONTROL</u>

Titus County Sheriff, Tim Ingram, explained to the Court that TxDOT is working on bridges and guardrails on I-30 and has asked if their office could help with temporary traffic control for 1 to 1-1/2 months. They would be paid \$15.00/hour/car for the use of two (2) vehicles which should generate approximately \$15,000 to \$18,000 back into the General Fund. Off duty personnel would be paid separately. The vehicles being used are due to be retired.

Motion was made by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Applewhite to approve the use of Sheriff's vehicles for temporary traffic control. Motion passed unanimously.

# 27. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TITUS</u> <u>COUNTY UNLIMITED TAX REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2017; APPOINTING A PRICING</u> <u>OFFICER AND DELEGATING TO THE PRICING OFFICER THE AUTHORITY TO APPROVE</u> <u>THE SALE OF THE BONDS; ESTABLISHING CERTAIN PARAMETERS FOR THE APPROVAL</u> <u>OF SUCH MATTERS; APPROVING AN ESCROW AGREEMENT AND PAYING</u> <u>AGENT/REGISTRAR AGREEMENT; LEVYING AN ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAX FOR THE</u> <u>PAYMENT OF THE BONDS AND ENACTING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE</u> <u>SUBJECT</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Riddle to approve an Order Authorizing the Issuance of Titus County Unlimited Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 2017; Appointing Hilltop Securities as a Pricing Officer and Delegating to the Pricing Officer the Authority to Approve the Sale of the Bonds; Establishing Certain Parameters for the Approval of such matters; Approving an Escrow Agreement and Paying Agent/Registrar Agreement; Levying an Annual Ad Valorem Tax for the Payment of the Bonds and Enacting other Provisions relating to the subject. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 19)

# 28. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY TAKE ACTION ON A PROPOSAL FROM PRINT WORKS</u> <u>REGARDING THE LEASE OF THE WITT BUILDING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE</u> <u>ANNEX NEXT TO ADULT PROBATION</u>

Owner and General Manager of Print Works, Stephen Terrell, brought to the Court a proposal to remodel the interior of the Witt building in exchange for six (6) months' rent free followed by a two (2) year lease signed on 01/01/2018 at \$500.00/month with Print Works paying all utilities. Titus County will pay for replacement of two (2) west windows and provide \$2000.00 cash contribution toward other construction works. (SEE ATTACHMENT 20) They will use local contractors with David Edwards being the General Contractor. The City Code Inspector will give approval before they move in.

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Applewhite to enter into an agreement with Print Works to rent free through the end of the year; begin a two (2) year signed lease on 01/01/2018 and authorize Judge Lee and Commissioner Riddle to oversee the remodeling efforts on behalf of Titus County. Motion passed unanimously.

Steve Austin brought to the Court's attention that the Historical Commission has signs stored in the building and will have to find another location for them.

# 29. <u>CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE TRAVEL AND SEMINARS FOR TITUS COUNTY</u> <u>EMPLOYEES AND ELECTED OFFICIALS</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Applewhite to approve travel and seminars for Titus County employees and elected officials. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 21)

#### **30. APPROVE ORAL AND WRITTEN REPORTS OF COUNTY OFFICIALS**

Motion was made by Commissioner Fields and seconded by Commissioner Applewhite to approve oral and written reports of county officials. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 22)

#### 31. CONSIDER AND POSSIBLY APPROVE TREASURER'S REPORT

Motion was made by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Fields to approve Treasurer's report. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 23)

# 32. <u>APPROVE BUDGET AMENDMENTS</u>

Motion was made by Commissioner Applewhite and seconded by Commissioner Fields to approve budget amendments #23-36. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 24)

#### 33. SIGN PAY ORDERS AND APPROVE PAYMENTS

Motion was made by Commissioner Applewhite and seconded by Commissioner Parker to sign pay orders and approve payments. Motion passed unanimously. (SEE ATTACHMENT 25)

#### 34. CLOSING COMMENTS BY COUNTY JUDGE AND COMMISSIONERS, IF ANY

Judge Lee informed the Court that Luminant has two (2) viable parties that are interested in operating the County Park. The Luminant Land Department will make a decision but will need another 30-60 days to finalize.

Judge Lee asked the Commissioners to be thinking about how they want to work with the City on providing restrooms for city events. They are presently using portable toilets but would like to have permanent facilities.

Judge Lee would like the Court to hold a Special meeting with Texas Association of Counties (TAC) regarding county health insurance and compare to what we now have.

Commissioner Riddle reported that the ground floor of the elevator needs tile replacement using the surplus tiles that are in storage. He will check on someone to do the job.

Commissioner Fields asked Commissioner Riddle if he had found anyone to dispose of used tires. Commissioner Riddle stated that he had checked with Upshur, Harrison and Dallas counties and was told that there was a grant that the county could apply for to get a shredder for the tires. The only company he had been able to locate was the company out of Paris that has been doing it in the past and they charge \$2.00/tire up to 18" and anything over that is \$1.00/inch. The Sheriff's office will provide labor to load the tires. Judge Lee will put this item on the next agenda.

#### ADJOURN:

Motion was made at 11:48 a.m. to adjourn by Commissioner Applewhite and seconded by Commissioner Parker. Motion passed unanimously.
