US CONSTITUTION The Second Amendment of the United States Constitution reads: "A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a Free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed."



US CONSTITUTION: Article VII, Clause 2; "This Constitution, and the laws of the United States which shall be made in pursuance thereof; and all treaties made, or which shall be made, under the authority of the United States, shall be the supreme law of the land; and the judges in every state shall be bound thereby, anything in the Constitution or laws of any State to the contrary notwithstanding.



TEXAS SB 4: After the March 13, 2017 ruling was announced, Texas Governor Greg Abbott updated his followers on Twitter, highlighting that claims the bill would lead to racial profiling were rejected. "Texas Ban on Sanctuary City Policies upheld by Federal Court of Appeals," he tweeted. "Allegations of discrimination were rejected. Law is in effect." Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton also praised the ruling, saying in a statement that SB 4 is constitutional and protects the safety of law enforcement officers and all Texans. "Enforcing immigration law prevents the release of individuals from custody who have been charged with serious crimes," he said. "Dangerous criminals shouldn't be allowed back into our communities to possibly commit more crimes." Reference: The U.S. 5th Circuit Court's March 13, 2018 ruling on Senate Bill 4 ...



SALUTING THE FLAG: A provision of the 2009 Defense Authorization Act changed federal law to allow U.S. veterans and military personnel not in uniform to render the military hand-salute when the national anthem is played. This change adds to a provision which was passed in the 2008 Defense Bill and signed by President George W. Bush, 43rd President of the United States, which authorized veterans and military personnel in civilian clothes to render the military salute during the raising, lowering or passing of the flag. All Active Duty Military should comply with the directives of the Commanding Officer for their Branch of Military Service. The US Flag Code directs all attending civilians to stand if possible and place right hand over their heart, all non-citizens will stand and remain still and quiet.



CUSTOMARY DATES TO FLY HALF-STAFF:

- *Peace Officers Memorial Day, May 15th, unless that day is also Armed Forces Day. (sunrise to sunset)
- *Memorial Day, last Monday in May (sunrise to noon)
- *Patriot Day, September 11th (sunrise to sunset)
- *National Firefighters Memorial Day, October (typically a Sunday during Fire Prevention Week and along with a memorial service held in Emmitsburg, MD)
- *Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day, December 7th (sunrise to sunset)

TCHC CONDUCTS Recorded Texas Historical Landmark Survey: TCHC found that 5 of the 10 RTHL's surveyed had been destroyed or is now in decay. The only structure of those five still standing (in part), is the WRM Slaughter Home, one mile east of the Greenhill Cemetery on FM 2152. This structure is overgrown, in decay and collapsing, no State Historical Marker was located. See attached THC Survey Forms.
