- ❖ Any proposals received after the date and/or hour set for the RFP opening will not be accepted. If proposals are sent by mail to the Auditor's Office, the bidder shall be responsible for actual delivery of the proposal to the Auditor's Office before the advertised date and hour for opening of RFPs. If mail is delayed either in the postal service or in the internal mail system of Titus County beyond the date and hour set for the RFP opening, bids thus delayed will not be considered.

# Scope of Work

The purpose of this request is to *primarily* contract for services with a licensed court interpreter to orally translate Spanish to English and English to Spanish as needed. However, interpreters of any and all languages, including *Sign* language should feel free to submit their qualifications for consideration as Titus County may determine that in order to meet the requirements of the various courts to award the contract to multiple vendors. Interpreter services shall be provided upon request of a Magistrate, a Justice Court, a County Court, or a District Court of the County, in any Criminal, Juvenile, Indigent Civil, or Mental Health proceeding when it is determined that a person charged or a witness does not understand and speak the English language. Respondents submitting the successful qualifications must clearly demonstrate the ability to provide technical expertise in this area.

In Civil cases, it shall not be the duty of the County to pay for interpreter services unless it is certified by the sitting Judge of that Court that the person or party responsible for the payment for interpreter services is indigent and is entitled to Court appointed services. In this case, the sitting Judge of that Court shall appoint an interpreter to provide such services. If interpreter services are provided for civil cases such as these, Titus County will be the single payor, and the court administrator will bill the appropriate party to reimburse the County for these costs.

Services will be performed for any of the above referenced courts on weekdays at any time between 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.

# **Proposal Submission Requirements**

This section outlines specific instructions for proposal submissions.

To facilitate the review of the responses, Proposers shall follow the described proposal format below. The intent of the proposal format requirements is to expedite review and evaluation. It is not the intent to constrain proposers with regard to content, but to assure that the specific requirements set forth in this RFP are addressed in a uniform manner to facilitate review and evaluation. Failure to arrange the proposal as requested may result in the disqualification of the proposal.

All proposals must be numbered and the proposal must contain an organized, paginated table of contents corresponding to the sections and pages of the proposal as described below.

  - Include resumes for each person to be assigned. Include any professional designations and affiliations, certifications and licenses.

- 2. References Qualified applicants will be required to provide the following;
  - Provide a list and/or a referral letter of at least three (3) references from bilingual
    professionals that you have worked with. For each reference, include the dates of service,
    name of the agency, contact name, telephone and email address.
  - Provide a list and/or a referral letter of at least three (3) references from district judges
    that you have worked with. For each reference, include the dates of service, name of the
    agency, contact name, telephone and email address.
- 3. Fee Structure- Qualified applicants must offer proposed fee structures for the following:
  - Provide a flat hourly rate stated in dollars (\$) per hour for interpreters
  - Provide a flat hourly rate stated in dollars (\$) per hour for any additional interpreters needed
  - Provide after hours and weekend hourly rates stated in dollars (\$) per hour
  - Provide a flat rate for each cancellation not given at least 48 hours in advance.

## **Evaluation Criteria/Process**

The evaluation committee shall screen and rate all of the responses that are submitted. Evaluation ratings will be on a 100 point scale and those proposers selected for a short list may be invited to attend an interview, at the proposers own expense. Any invitation for an oral presentation will be solely for the purpose of clarifying proposals received from each qualifying proposer, and will not represent any decision on the part of the evaluation committee as to the selection of a successful proposer.

The evaluation committee will consist of the district judges, a prosecutor and possibly an attorney. The final decision as to members of the evaluation committee shall rest with the district judges and the county judge.

The evaluation committee will evaluate all proposals based on the following criteria:

Once proposals are scored, the evaluation team will select finalists and decide whether interviews should be conducted. After interviews are performed, if needed, the evaluation team may request the finalists to submit a Best and Final Offer (BAFO) or they may negotiate a contract with the top ranked finalist.

This RFP does not commit the County to pay for any direct and/or indirect costs incurred in the preparation and presentation of a response. All finalist(s) shall pay their own costs incurred in responding to, preparing for, traveling to and attending interviews.

The County reserves the right to negotiate the final fee prior to recommending any proposer for a contract and to award a contract to one or more vendors for these services.

The County reserves the right to use all pertinent information (also learned from sources other than disclosed in the RFP process) that might affect the County's judgment as to the appropriateness of an award to the best evaluated proposer. This information may be appended to the proposal evaluation process results.



To become a Licensed Court Interpreter, you must do the following:

- Complete the Exam Orientation Course. Applicants must successfully complete a 6 hour Commission
  Approved Orientation course before they are eligible to take the written and oral examinations. The certificate of
  completion must be submitted with the Application for Licensure.
- Submit the Application for Licensure and Exam Registration Form. You must apply for licensure and
  register for the exam via our online licensing and certification system. To apply online, please go to the online
  certification and licensing system on our home page.
- 3. Submit the application fee. Please see the Fees section of this page for information on amounts due, acceptable forms of payment, etc.
- 4. Pass a criminal history background check by DPS and the FBI. Applicants that apply for certification online will receive the service code form via the automated email confirmation they receive after submitting their application for certification. The course is designed to help candidates deliver services in a manner faithful to all professional responsibilities and ethics, and court policies regarding court interpreting promulgated by the judiciary. The course should provide information and discussion about what the profession requires to help students decide whether and how to proceed with the pursuit of a license as a court interpreter.

#### **Criminal History**

All new applicants, and those renewing their certifications are required to obtain one-time electronic Fingerprinting through the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS). 
