


Celebrate National 4-H Week

RELEVANCE

According to the US Census, Titus County's population is 32,623 with 28.8 percent (approx. 9,000) under the age of 18 and eligible for Extension youth programs.

This is the 4-H Management and 4-H Membership Expansion plan. It includes leadership of the 4-H youth development program which includes 4-H clubs/groups, Club Managers, volunteer leaders, and the 4-H Program Area Committee.

4-H brings youth and adults together to learn everyday skills with hands-on learning. Activities from animal and plant sciences to robotics, teach 4-H'ers problem-solving skills that make a positive impact upon their community. 4-H helps youth meet the diverse challenges of today's world, build self-confidence, learn responsibility, and make positive decisions.

The five major project areas in 4-H include Agriculture and Livestock, Family and Community Health, Natural Resources, Leadership and Citizenship, Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM).

RESPONSE

Volunteer work is an important component of the 4-H program. The Titus County Youth Program Area Committee, 4-H members, club managers and volunteer leaders are provided training in order to plan successful clubs, projects, activities and events that enhance youth experiences and contribute to their development in the areas of life skills, responsibilities, leadership and citizenship. A variety of promotional and educational methods were used to manage and implement a successful County 4-H program.

- 4-H Kickoff/Open House-(August, 2021)-Attended the Home-School Night Event to promote 4-H and recruit new members.
- Titus County Fair-(September 2021)- 4-H Members exhibit their livestock projects and promote good leadership and citizenship.
- Plant Identification (August-May)- The Plant Identification Team meets weekly September-May in preparation for Contests across the state of Texas.
- Livestock Judging (August-May)- The Livestock Judging Team is composed of approximately 10 individuals who meet weekly September-May in preparation for Contests across the state of Texas.
- Food and Nutrition Projects- Family & Community Health Agent served as the coach.
- Kid's Cooking School theme was Grilling-BBQ Time. Monthly classes
 included grilling safety, foil packet meals, meals in a jar, Grinch Brunch,
 emergency management meals (freeze dried meals which can be
 preserved up to 25 years) The kids ate freeze dried taco soup by
 candlelight due to "pretend" power outage.

Texas 4-H is the largest youth development program in Texas with more than 550,000 youth enrolled each year. Texas 4-H is part of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas A&M System. Since 1908, youth have been gaining valuable lifeskills through hands-on activities taught and supported by adult volunteers and Extension Agents.
